

"Swiss it on Wheels"

A wonderful workshop called "Swiss it on Wheels" was organised in collaboration with The Embassy of Switzerland to India and Bhutan on 2nd August 2022 at South City International School. Around 200 participants took part in it from grades VII, VIII along with the Art students of classes IX to XII.

The students were mentored by a team of mentors in two time slots right from the beginning of the event that consisted of a virtual tour of Switzerland and various aspects of conservation. Then they were taught to recycle a t-shirt into a carry bag and a carton into a waste bin.

The event was a great success as all the students had whole-heartedly contributed towards the same and their creativity and diligence got reflected.

Learning Objective: Students were sensitised about the various aspects of low-tech cleaning solutions to counter indoor air and water pollution, simplification of waste segregation and recycling, measuring one's carbon footprint and so on. The main objective was to make students more environment-friendly and conscious.

The act of recycling plastic and other waste materials is rarely followed in the countries around the world, especially in our country, India. Hence, this workshop is being held in different schools of India to spread the awareness of recycling which is the need of the hour, as, in India, pollution is increasing day by day and so is the need of recycling. Therefore, the ways of recycling presented by the teachers of this workshop are very important to pay heed to. These ways are quite easy to perform and can be executed in every household. This workshop sensitized the students on how to care for our immediate environment. The workshop was not only focused on reduction of pollution but also to control global warming which is a drastic effect of pollution.

After all these information we had a small questionnaire session to measure our water footprint which helped us calculate how much water we use in our daily life. This was followed by an activity in which most of us took an old t-shirt and made a bag out of it which can be used for various purposes.

Summing it all up, we students enjoyed a lot during this thoughtful workshop which enlightened us of the current scenario of the world's environment.

Principal Sir, teachers, staff members and parents took part whole-heartedly in donating blood. A week prior to the event an awareness programme was held


in our school auditorium by the 'Blood Connect'. The donors were asked to fill a medical form to give details about their health-related information.



These books will explore topics that can help you children to become more confident and competent in every area of life.


I am Stronger Than Anger by Elizabeth Cole


How Full Is Your Bucket? for Kids by M. Reckmeyer & Tom Rath



One of the most important lessons we teach our



Layla's happiness by Mariahadessa Ekere Tallie





I Love Me by Sally Morgan & Ambelin Kwaymuliina




