Topic: World Braille Day




Date: 24.01.22















REPORT ON DECODING NEP – 2020

On January 27, 2022 at 16.30hrs the session begins with Dr. Amrita Dass (ICS founder chair), the most informative message on Kothari Commission and the implementation of first Education policy in 1968 with universal education right up to 14 years of age group. She also emphasis on today's educational system largely entrusted on the youth with applied knowledge, which was well laid out in New Education Policy of 2020.

The session gradually became more meaningful with thought provoking questions in regard to the



implementation of NEP 2020 and what are the key elements to be considered in changing landscape? Thus, my learning objectives from this session was to get an idea on how to make my student career ready in future and various inter-disciplinary subject combination that a student can take up and the rubrics of career option in this VUCA world. It was rightly stated by Dr. Dass that Gen Z attention span was hardly 3-5 minutes. Still, they are involved in various startups which was highly appreciable and they seek an identity in the society. The education pattern has changed from what is

taught to how to teach.

Covid 2020 and subsequently lockdown has made us to radically adopt the NEP 2020, which is primarily on hybrid model of learning.

The next guest speaker Ms. Shalini Sinha has explicitly explained the new NEP 2020. Mrs.

Jyotsna Brar (Principal of Welham's School, Dehradun) spoke in details about multidisciplinary subject choice mechanism by tweaking the existing time table. Ms. Meenakshi Sahni (Principal Modern School, Vasant Vihar),



emphasis on democratic citizenship curriculum on age appropriate to be introduced since kindergarten level. She also emphasis on paid leave for teachers to reflect, study and relearn the subject of their choice and for its effective implementation school owners, senior management, board members, Principal or Administrator will need the required orientation.

The session was quite enriching and no one realized how time flies. In between Dr. Dass also answered various queries. Finally like all good things comes to an end. The session also ended at 19.10 hrs.

My takeaway from the session / learning outcome-

- Ø Democratic Citizenship based curriculum which will be child centric.
- Ø A quiet space to be created within the school premise where the students can reflect and meditate for an overall holistic development.
- Ø Paid leave for teachers to reflect, study and learn for an overall spiritual growth.



Swami Vivekananda's birthday or National Youth Day is on 12th January, we remember him for his inspiration to the mankind .He taught us unconditional love, reinforced the importance of giving back and taught us how to be a better person,

"Fill the brain with high thoughts, highest ideas, place them day and night before you and out of that will come great work."

Narendranath Dutta was born in a well-educated family with strong principles. He received an appropriate religious upbringing .He was taught by Ramakrishna Paramhansa that God lives in every human and by serving mankind, we can serve God. His journey to a wonderful divine experience began and because of the most important disciple of the saint, he established the RAMAKRISHNA MISSION.

An organization that still today engages in voluntary social service to the poor and helpless. The first Indian monk who went to America to participate in the Parliament of World Religions in Chicago in 1893. He is perhaps best known for his speech which began with the words "Sisters and brothers of America" in which he introduced Hinduism. In his lecture he explained the concept of God being one and that each religion is like a different river flowing towards a common sea.

His message to the Nation was –"Arise, Awake and Stop until the goal is achieved." So, let us grow from the inside out with Swami Vivekananda's thoughts. As he said-

"None can teach you, none can make you spiritual, there is no other teacher but your own soul."

Swami Vivekananda Swami Vivekananda was an Indian Hindu monk and philosopher. He was a disciple of Ramakrishna. He contributed to the concept of nationalism in colonial India. After Ramakrisna's death, he travelled around the Indian Subcontinent extensively and acquired much knowledge of the conditions prevailing in British India. At the 1893 Parliament of World's Religions, which took place in the United States, he represented India. It was there that he gave his famous Chicago speech. He taught people about Hindu philosophy in England, United States and Europe. He died on 4th July 1902, aged 39, in Belur Math. In India, he is respected as a patriotic saint, and his birthday is celebrated as National Youth Day. "The whole secret of existence is to have no fear. Never fear what will become of you, depend on no one. Only the moment you reject all help are you freed"






KOLKATA DISTRICT PROGRAMME BY BHARAT & SCOUTS TO CELEBRATE REPUBLIC DAY ON





On 21st January, 2022, an online webinar was organised by Bharati Bhawan on NEP.


The following points were discuss & explained in detail:

- 5. Gender Inclusion Fund, for assisting the nation in the education of female and transgender children.





Overall it was a highly engaging workshop and we were happy to be a part of it.











The word library comes from Latin **liber** – the inner bark of trees – and was first used in written form in the 14th century.

The three best-selling books in the world are the Holy Bible (6 billion copies), Quotations from Chairman Mao Tse-Tung (900 million), and the Harry Potter series (500 million copies sold).

The world's oldest continually operating library was established in AD 565. It is housed in Saint Catherine's Monastery at the foot of Mount Sinai in Egypt, and has the second largest collection of ancient manuscripts after the Vatican City.

The longest sentence ever printed consists of **832** words. You may find it in **Victor Hugo's "Miserables".** By the way, the novel was translated into 60 languages and adapted to screen countless times. It's loved by millions of fans all over the world and is a highly recommended read.

World's tallest book is over 6 feet. The world's tallest book, "Collection of Maritime Rules", is stored in the Amsterdam Museum. Its height is about 6.4 feet, and it's over 3 feet wide.

The most expensive book ever purchased was bought by Bill Gates for \$30.8 million - it was The Codex Leicester by Leonardo Da Vinci, and had been written in 1510.

The most famous book thief: In his entire criminal career, **Steven Bloomberg** stole **23,000** rare books from **268** libraries. By the way, people who steal books are called **Bibliocleptomanes**.

'Bibliosma' is the word for loving the way books smell.

Bibliophile: a person who collects or has a great love of books

Alice in Wonderland is based on a real 10-year-old girl with whom Lewis Carroll was friends. She was called Alice Liddell, and, whilst out on a boating trip, asked Caroll to tell her a story.

Roald Dahl is buried with some of his favorite items: a bottle of Burgundy, his snooker cues, HB pencils, a power saw and some chocolate. He was buried in November 1990 in Oxford, England, and according to his granddaughter, the family gave him a "sort of Viking funeral". Today, children continue to leave toys and flowers by his grave.

The first book ever written on a typewriter was The Adventures of Tom Sawyer by Mark Twain.

The country that reads the most is India, with the average Indian reading 10.7 hours per week. Americans only read half as much, at just over 5 hours per week.
